

WHAT:

The North Side Kairos retreat is a **4-day retreat** for Chicago teens who have just **completed their Sophomore, Junior, or Senior years of high school.**

WHY:

This is the question you should really ask!

Why should I spend time reflecting on my life at a retreat? It is hard to know until you have tried. Maybe you are scared about going off to college. Maybe you are trying to decide if you want to go to college. Maybe you are hurt. Maybe you are healed—and wish to rejoice. Maybe you don't know if God really cares. Maybe you are scared to find out how much He does.

There are **so many reasons** those who have already gone on Kairos could give you about why you should go, but first you have to choose to trust them. Thousands of teens go on Kairos each year. They go and discover who they really are and how they want to live. They come for their own reasons. All leave changed.

Maybe the best reason to go is that **someone cares enough about you to invite you.** Talk to past Kairos participants, youth ministers or priests and ask them why. Even if your decision is not to go, you owe it to yourself to explore why so many people consider that a retreat is an essential experience in your life.

WHERE:

The retreat takes place at **Bellarmino Jesuit Retreat House** in Barrington, Illinois. Retreatants leave from **St. Nicholas Parish in Evanston** and ride together to the retreat house.

WHEN:

Friday, August 12 at 5:00 p.m. until **Monday, August 15** in the evening

COST:

The cost of the retreat is **\$225** per participant. All lodging, meals and transportation covered. Checks should be **payable to St. Nicholas Parish.** A **non-refundable deposit of \$50** is required when the application is turned in. The remaining balance must be received by Friday, August 12. There are limited funds for **financial aid**, which are given on a first-come, first-served basis.

HOW:

The first step is to fill out an **application.** If you do not already have an application, you can email or call the retreat coordinators listed. Please hurry because the retreat fills up quickly, and applying earlier may mean better access to financial aid.
